



HORNINGLOW CHURCH.

The township of Horninglow contains a population of more than two thousands, and has no established place of worship.

A Committee has, therefore, been formed for the purpose of promoting the building of a Church which will accommodate at least four hundred persons; two-thirds of the sittings to be free and unappropriated.

Subscriptions have already been promised to the amount of £1,600.

This sum, though sufficient to encourage the Committee in their exertions, is still very inadequate to build the Church (the estimated cost of which is about £1,800), and to provide an Endowment. The Committee, therefore, earnestly solicit the kind assistance of the Clergy, Nobility, Gentry, and public towards the accomplishment of the desired object, a site for which has liberally been given by The Most Noble the Marquis of Anglesea.
